BIKE PARKING SCORECARD

SHORT-TERM BIKE PARKING (2 hours or less):

Bike racks support the bicycle frame in at least two places and allow both the frame and the wheel to be locked with a U-lock

15 POINTS Bike racks have at least 2' of clearance on all sides

10 POINTS Parking is within 50' of the building entrance

10 POINTS Parking does not require user to lift bicycle

LONG-TERM BIKE PARKING (more than 2 hours):

20 POINTS Locker or secure bike room or cage only accessible to users

15 POINTS Weather-protected

10 POINTS Provides a minimum 4' aisle

10 POINTS Visible from building entrance or has guide signs

SHORT AND LONG-TERM PARKING:

Is consistently no more than 80% full

SCORE:

50 - 65: This bike parking is great!

40 – 50: This bike parking could be improved with a few small changes

30 - 40: This bike parking is mediocre

0 – 30: This bike parking is poor

SHORT-TERM BIKE PARKING (2 hours or less):
